Beloit College recently hosted a student-coordinated thirdwave feminism conference that drew over 200 participants. The undergraduate students who organized the conference did so in response to what they had experienced as dismissive attitudes toward undergraduate-student issues and concerns by various feminist academics. Students at Beloit College want to spread the idea and the basic know-how that would help reproduce this event on other campuses and have put together a “STUDENT-COORDINATED CONFERENCE HANDBOOK.”

Although much of the information is Beloit-specific, the handbook includes short student essays from each of the organizers about how they initially advertised the conference, structured the division of labor, what worked, what didn't work, what they would do differently if given the opportunity etc. Also included is a snapshot of the website used to spread infor-

mation/collect proposals and registrations, sample letters to campus funders, sample fliers, the conference schedule, and a participant list.
